

9 SENSORY FOOTPATH



BIG IDEA: We use our senses to explore the world around us.

OBJECTIVE: Students will be able to name the 5 senses and explain how they have used all of their senses during their visit to the farm.

VOCABULARY

- SENSES what we use to experience or understand our surroundings: touch, taste, smell, sight and hearing
- HERBS plants that we use to add flavor to our food
- **SPICES** the dried parts of plants that add flavor to our food

MATERIALS

- Sensory Scavenger Hunt (attached)
- Extra herbs

Paper/pencil for tracing hand

ENGAGE: The engage section is designed to activate students' prior knowledge and experiences, pique their interest, and build curiosity.

Welcome students to the Sensory Footpath.

Share that they will now have a chance to take off their shoes and use their senses to fully experience the moment. They can walk down the sensory footpath or explore the nearby area.

Review the 5 senses and ask students to name a few of the things they have seen, heard, touched, smelled or tasted so far during their visit.





SENSORY FOOTPATH



EXPLORE: These hands-on and minds-on investigations offer an opportunity for students to further explore the Big Idea of the lesson.

INVESTIGATION 1:

EXPLORING WITH YOUR SENSES. The attached *Sensory Scavenger Hunt* can help guide students as they explore their surroundings using all their senses. They may need to walk off the path to complete the challenge.

INVESTIGATION 2:

EXPLORING WITH YOUR SENSES PART 2. Trace your hand on a sheet of paper (or the attached *Exploring with Your Senses Worksheet* and label each finger with one sense. Then, take one item – a leaf, flower, rock, insect, or herb as you smell, touch, listen, watch and then, if appropriate, taste.



EVALUATE AND CLOSE: Before moving on to the next station, pleas few moments to have students reflect on what they have learned.

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• Ask students to share something they discovered by actively focusing on using all their senses.
